**Each student and parent/guardian will be required to sign a Code of Conduct, Photo release form (if applicable), Emergency contact form and a Medical Consent form for the YES Academy once the participants are selected. The Code of Conduct rules have been included below. (Please keep for your records)

Code of Conduct

To help ensure that the Youth Entrepreneurship Summer Academy is a positive and enjoyable growth experience for all students, it is necessary to establish and enforce high standards of behavior. These standards apply to all students throughout the academy. The following is an agreement between you and the YES Academy. Please read carefully. Your signature on this Contract Agreement is required for you to participate in the 2010 YES Academy. You, not the YES Academy or anyone else, are responsible for the consequences of your acts, and any action you take in violation of state or federal law, University policy, or this Agreement will have consequences, including possibly dismissal from the program and a referral to relevant authorities. The following list of specifically prohibited acts is not all-inclusive and is subject to changes and/or modifications.

1. Alcoholic beverages: The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverage on university property is prohibited. In addition, the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited at off-campus, residence hall, or program sponsored functions. Violation of this policy will result in immediate dismissal from the program.
2. Illegal drugs: The possession, manufacture, sale or use of marijuana, narcotics, or other dangerous drugs on university property or at off-campus residence halls, or program-sponsored functions, is prohibited. Violation of this policy will result in immediate dismissal from the program.
3. Weapons: Unauthorized possession, use, or sale of any explosive or destructive device (including dangerous or concealed weapons such as knives, blades, clubs, firearms, firecrackers, etc.) on the university campus is prohibited. Any student in violation of this policy will be dismissed immediately from the YES Academy.
4. Theft: Theft on or off university campus is unlawful. This applies to any activity beyond the university campus itself. Any student caught in the act of theft where evidence exists to substantiate conviction will be dismissed immediately from the program. Campus security will be notified of on-campus theft at the discretion of the Director. Any person caught in the act of theft off campus will be subject to the jurisdiction of the of the city police.

Program Code of Conduct:

1. YES Academy students **must attend** all sessions at all times and remain in sessions from beginning to end.
2. YES Academy students must show courtesy and respect for others at all times. Remember elevator etiquette.
3. MP3 players (iPods, Zune, etc.) and all electronic music players are prohibited during the Campus Tour, Meal Time, Classes, Guest Speakers, Group Activities and Final Presentation.
4. YES Academy students must dress appropriately at all times and are encouraged to dress up for the Final Group Presentation. Attire should conform to the established standards of YES Academy, especially during conference sessions. There should be no t-shirts or other clothing with profanity, inappropriate imagery, or sexual or racial innuendo. Pants should not sag to expose undergarments.

See-through or revealing clothing should not be worn. No hats or scarves are allowed at the conference. Attire that exposes the midriff or that has spaghetti straps is inappropriate at the conference.

5. Students must wear name tags at all times during the YES Academy.
6. Students must listen to and respect their advisor, any other advisor, or any staff member that may address them.
7. Students will be required to have their cell phones turned off during Campus Tour, Class Sessions, Guest Speaker presentations, Group Activities and Final Presentation.
8. Meal Tickets. All students will be issued a meal ticket. It is understood that these meal tickets are to be used only by the person to whom it is issued. If you lose your ticket, it is your responsibility to notify staff.

Dormitory Code of Conduct:

1. Keys: Each student will be provided a room key. The cost of replacing a key is \$45.00/room key. Students are responsible for the room key.
2. Curfew: Curfew hour for all students is 11:00 p.m. Program staff will enforce the curfew hour.
3. Quiet hours: Quiet hours in the residence halls will be in effect from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
4. Guests of opposite gender: Only YES Academy students can occupy a room. There is no visitation in rooms by persons of the opposite gender. Visitation by parents or family members is restricted to the residence hall lobby. Housing staff has the right request ID from anyone visiting in the residential halls.
5. Radio, TV's, Stereos: All such equipment must be operated so as to not annoy other residents or interfere with quiet hours.
6. Room damage: Any damage done to your room is considered your responsibility, and you will be charged accordingly. In addition, any student who damages university property will be subject to immediate disciplinary action.
7. Room Inspection: All rooms are subject to inspection or maintenance by authorized personnel to insure proper care and to verify occupancy.
8. Telephone usage: There are no telephones in the residential halls. You may bring a cellular phone from home for your own use. You are responsible for all charges for personal long distance calls.
9. Window/Back door exits: For security and other reasons, all window and back doors must remain closed at all time.
10. Gambling: Gambling of any nature is strictly prohibited in the university residence halls.
11. Pets: No pets of any kind may be kept in a residence hall.
